

CRITERIA FOR MEMBERSHIP

The election of any person to the Hall of Fame is a distinct honor, and while the criteria are guidelines, the ultimate decision as to who shall receive this honor is to be made solely by the committee, who recognizes that the achievements of the honoree far exceed what is considered exceptional in his or her field. The committee shall use the below criteria as bench marks for consideration.

CRITERIA

1. A multiple letter winner in the Whittier College intercollegiate athletic program; plus, must be on the First Team All-Conference for two years, or on the First Team All-Conference in two different sports; **or**
2. Named to First Team NAIA All-District or NCAA All-West Region team for two years in any sport; **or**
3. An All-American or mention selection in any sport; **or**
4. A National or World Champion in any sport; **or**
5. A United States Olympic Team member; **or**
6. The holder of a Pacific Coast, National or World Record; **or**
7. Successful as a professional athlete.

RULES

1. "Honorary Membership" selections may be made if the individual has made an outstanding contribution to Whittier College's athletic program or has attained recognition at the state, national or world level as a coach, athlete or national leader.
2. No candidate shall be considered for selection to the Whittier College Athletic Hall of Fame until five years after graduation from the College, unless under exceptional circumstances.
3. All candidates under consideration must have been in good standing while competing on an athletic team and must have graduated from Whittier College.

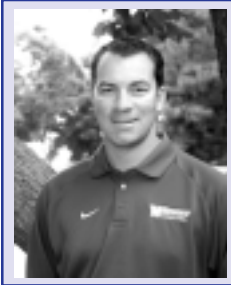

His roles span commercials, TV, and movies, including *Taking Care of Business*, in which he worked alongside future Hall of Fame players Roger Clemens and Bert Blylevan.
